- Open with prayer.
- If your groups is new, give everyone time to introduce themselves.

CONVERSATION STARTERS

- What's one thing you're looking forward to in the future?
- Share something new or a highlight from this past week.

REVIEW

Open your Bibles and read from **John 14:5-14**.

- Share your favourite points from the weekend sermon. What spoke to you?
- Share a phrase or moment that you related to the most, or a question you may have from the weekend.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- What's your relationship with your earthly father like? Your heavenly Father?
- What does it mean for you to "believe in God the Father almighty"?
- In John 14:6, Jesus describes himself as the way, the truth, and the life – what's the significance of these terms?
- The second half of verse 6 says, "no one can come to the father except through me." What do you think Jesus wanted to communicate by saying this?
- In verses 7, Jesus says "If you really know me, you will know my Father as well", what does this mean?
- What do you think it means to ask for something "in Jesus' name"?
- Spend some time reflecting on what a healthy relationship with our heavenly Father looks like.
- How do these verses apply to your life? What will you do about it?

PRAISE & PRAYER POINTS

Share what God is doing in your life and spend some time praying for each other's prayer requests.

APOSTLES' CREED

Close by reading the Apostles' Creed:

I believe in God the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

And in Jesus Christ, his only son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontus Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended to hell, on the third day rose again from the dead, ascended to heaven, sits at the right hand of God the Father almighty, thence he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.
