- Share your favourite points from the weekend sermon. What spoke to you?
- Share a phrase or moment that you related to the most, or a question you may have from the weekend.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- What does 'life everlasting' mean to you?
- How do we get past our unanswerable questions and embrace the mystery of forever with God? What do you think that looks like? Is embracing mystery hard for you? Why or why not?
- Read Ezekiel 47:1-2, 9, 12. The last chapter of Revelation picks up the vision from Ezekiel and shows us the fulfillment of it. How can this future reality revealed in Revelation and promised in Ezekiel bring us hope?
- How does the hope of life everlasting impact the way we live now?
- In light of eternity, is there anything you need to re-evaluate in your life?
- How do these verses apply to your life? What will you do about it?

PRAISE & PRAYER POINTS

Share what God is doing in your life and spend some time praying for each other's prayer requests.
