



It's hard to know what "church" is supposed to be anymore with so many people reevaluating what role the weekend gathering has in their faith. What does it mean to be part of a community of Jesus-followers that's so much bigger than just FAC?

- Open with prayer.
- If your groups is new, give everyone time to introduce themselves.

CONVERSATION STARTERS

- What's one thing you're looking forward to in the future?
- Share something new or a highlight from this past week.

REVIEW

Open your Bibles and read from **1 Corinthians 12:4-31**.

- Share your favourite points from the weekend sermon. What spoke to you?
- Share a phrase or moment that you related to the most, or a question you may have from the weekend.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- Who are the people who have had the greatest impact on your life? Why?
- What does it mean to be part of a community? What does it mean for you to belong?
- In your own words, how would you describe what “church” is supposed to be?
- In what ways are the spiritual gifts listed different from a natural talent or ability?
- As a follower of Jesus, do you have a sense of what your gifts or gifts might be?
- Do you see your part in the mission of God through His church as indispensable? Why or why not?
- How do these verses apply to your life? What will you do about it?

PRAISE & PRAYER POINTS

Share what God is doing in your life and spend some time praying for each other's prayer requests.

THE APOSTLES' CREED

Close by reading the Apostles' Creed:

I believe in God the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

And in Jesus Christ, his only son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontus Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended to hell, on the third day rose again from the dead, ascended to heaven, sits at the right hand of God the Father almighty, thence he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.
