# DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- In verse 19, Paul gives descriptions of those who live as “enemies of the cross.” What four statements are made about them? What do those statements mean?
- What does it mean that we are citizens of heaven? What difference does this fact make in your life? How does it affect your outlook, your behavior, and your priorities?
- How does the promise of a new body help you deal with the limitations of your current body? Describe, to the best of your ability, what you think your transformed body will look like.
- Does the reality of this bodily transformation cause you to “eagerly await” Jesus’ return? What can you do to increase your expectancy of the Savior’s return?
- How do these verses apply to your life? What will you do about it?
