	<i>Day 1 (June 6)</i> New Movements Pray that we will stop following the failed strategies of the past, but rather lift up the person of Jesus Christ who is fully able to draw all men, including Muslims, to Himself.	<i>Day 2 (June 7)</i> North Africa - Berbers Pray that the emerging Christian movements in North Africa will endure despite government efforts at Arabisation and Islamisation. (1 Corinthians 15:58)	<i>Day 3 (June 8)</i> Maures of Mauritania Pray that the Arab-Berber Maures, a former nomadic people, will find their way to Jesus. (Jeremiah 29:13)	<i>Day 4 (June 9)</i> West Africa – Discovering Christ 100 million West African Muslims in 514 distinct ethnolinguistic people groups. Pray for those who remain unaware of the reality of Christ in this diverse region.	<i>Day 5 (June 10)</i> Garibou Boys of West Africa Originally a way to train boys in Islamic values and Qu’ran memorisation, the Garibou system has become modern-day child exploitation, trafficking and slavery. (Isaiah 61:1-3)	<i>Day 6 (June 11)</i> East Africa Pray for followers of Isa al-Masih in East Africa to have wisdom and courage as they live their faith in their local Muslim communities. (Matthew 5:13-16)
<i>Day 7 (June 12)</i> The Afar: Unknown Future Pray that keys to communicating the message of Jesus clearly to those proud nomadic warriors & herdsman will be discovered and shared. (Isaiah 40:3)	<i>Day 8 (June 13)</i> Arab World - Amaal Pray for Muslim-background believers like Amaal (a young woman) who suffer persecution for their faith in Jesus Christ. (Matthew 10:17-20)	<i>Day 9 (June 14)</i> Iraq: From Empire to Chaos Pray for the persevering Christian minorities – that through their practical love and witness, many will find Christ. (Acts 2:44-47)	<i>Day 10 (June 15)</i> Turkestan: Led By the Spirit Pray for courageous missionaries who are taking the gospel to each of Turkestan’s 227 Muslim people groups. (Hebrews 10:32-39)	<i>Day 11 (June 16)</i> Turkey: A Crossroads for Refugees Pray for the Syrian refugees in Turkey who have been there for many years, longing for home. Pray for peace in Syria according to Psalm 46:9.	<i>Day 12 (June 17)</i> Persian Room: Haik Hovsepian Pray for bold Christian witnesses like Bishop Haik Hovsepian to continue to take the gospel to the Persian World’s Shi’ite Muslim population. (Acts 28:31)	<i>Day 13 (June 18)</i> Tajikistan: Seeking Jesus Pray that Tajik hearts would open to the good news of Jesus, and that Tajiks would have opportunities to meet Christians who would lovingly share Jesus with them.
<i>Day 14 (June 19)</i> Western South Asia Pray for the war-torn nations of Western South Asia, that they find a new path forward through Jesus, the Prince of Peace. (Isaiah 9:6)	<i>Day 15 (June 20)</i> Deobandis, North India Pray for the town of Deoband to be a place of peace and blessing. That the Hindu/Muslim tensions that often erupt in the region would have no place there.	<i>Day 16 (June 21)</i> Eastern South Asia Pray for the 284 million lost Muslims in Eastern South Asia to come to faith in Jesus Christ. Pray for bold witnesses to endure persecution and remain faithful to Christ.	<i>Day 17 (June 22)</i> Bihar, India Pray that the Spirit of God and the Word of God would draw Muslim leaders and whole family groups throughout Bihar to Jesus. (Isaiah 55:11)	<i>Day 18 (June 23)</i> Indo-Malaysia Pray that effective gospel methods such as satellite television, the Jesus film, personal Christian witness and Any-3 will continue to spread the gospel.	<i>Day 19 (June 24)</i> An Indonesian Journey Pray for Indonesians on a <i>merantau</i> (journey), that those wandering aimlessly would wander right into the Kingdom of God. (Jeremiah 29:12-14)	<i>Day 20 (June 25)</i> Western Cham of Cambodia Pray for a movement of Cham people to faith in Jesus. Pray for the ongoing translation of the Scriptures in their heart language. (Hebrews 4:12)
<i>Day 21 (June 26)</i> The Journey of Faith Pray for Muslims who are questioning their faith, that they will meet others who have walked that journey and found it led them to Christ. (John 8:32)	<i>Day 22 (June 27)</i> Seeking God’s Presence Pray for Muslims who are longing for a greater understanding of God’s presence, that they will find Him through any possible means. (Romans 8:13-15)	<i>Day 23 (June 28)</i> Luton: A Stand Against Extremism 1 John 4:18 says, “Perfect love drives out fear.” Repent of fear and ask God to fill you and your community with love for Muslims.	<i>Day 24 (June 29)</i> US Migrants: A Global Gateway Pray for ministries such as Global Gates that are crossing cultural barriers to engage these unreached people groups that God has brought to our cities.	<i>Day 25 (June 30)</i> The Muslim Rohingya Refugees in western Myanmar, uprooted and without a homeland, without advocates, and without hope. But God, “does not forget the cry of the afflicted.” (Psalm 9:13)	<i>Day 26 (July 1)</i> Night of Power Pray for dream catchers – believers who can help Muslims understand who the “being of light” in their dreams is and how He wants them to follow Him. (Matthew 17:1-2)	<i>Day 27 (July 2)</i> Yida – Refugees in South Sudan Like Jesus did with parables, motivated believers are trained to tell biblical content in exciting ways and to answer questions from their Muslim compatriots. (John 4:35)
<i>Day 28 (July 3)</i> Syria & Its Refugees Pray for the end of the conflict in Syria, for the millions of refugees and their physical, psychological, and spiritual needs. God is able. (Acts 17:26-17)	<i>Day 29 (July 4)</i> Muslim Idiom Translations Pray for the continued translation of the Bible into local Muslim languages and dialects so that all Muslims will understand the gospel message. (Isaiah 55:11)	<i>Day 30 (July 5)</i> Institutions and Viruses Pray for the emerging movements to Christ in North Africa and across the House of Islam that are spreading form person to person by the thousands.
